

This was the "little way" in which Therese sought to follow. Her philosophy was that — what was important was not doing great works, but doing little things with the power of love. She believed that if we can maintain the right attitude, then nothing shall remain that can't be accomplished.

Therese had the ambition to become a missionary and travel to Africa or China. However, ill health curtailed these plans, and she was forced to stay in the convent. Towards the end of her life. when she was increasingly bed-ridden, St Therese was encouraged by the elder nuns to write down her way of spiritual practice. She wrote three books that explained her "little way" and included her personal spiritual autobiography 'Story of a Soul'.


BINGO
